

Tiny cowl for a mounted alpaca

Yarn: About 10 yards of fingering weight in 2 colors

Needles: 4 double pointed US 1 or US 2

Stuffing: pinch of poly stuffing or yarn

Cast on 15 stitches

Knit 5 rows in color 1

Knit 1 row in color 2

Knit 4 rows in color 1

Knit 2 rows in color 2

Knit 3 rows in color 1

Knit 3 rows in color 2

Knit 2 rows in color 1

Knit 4 row in color 2

Bind off using a stretchy bind-off method:
*knit 2 stitches together through the back loop. Transfer the single stitch back to the left needle. Repeat from * until 1 stitch is left. Pull your through loop and weave in ends.

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Ornaments for a mounted moose

Yarn: About 5 yards of fingering weight color 1, 1 yard fingering weight color 2

Needles: 4 double pointed US 1 or US 2

Stuffing: pinch of poly stuffing or yarn

Row 1: Cast on 6 stitches and begin knitting in the round

Row 2: (kfb) 6 times 12sts

Row 3: (kfb, k1) 6 times 18 sts

Row 4: knit 18 sts

Row 5 (kfb, k2) 6 times 24 sts

Row 6: change to color 2: knit 24sts

Row 7: change to color 1: knit 24 sts

Row 8: (k2tog, k2) 6 times 18 sts

Row 9: knit 18 sts

Row 10: (k2tog, k1) 6 times 12 sts

Stuff the inside before continuing

Row 11: (k2tog) 6 times 6 sts

Gather stitches and cinch tight to close the top of the ornament. Weave in ends and attach a loop at the top for hanging.

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Tiny Hat for a Mounted Bison

Yarn: About 15 yards of fingering weight (optional: pom-pom)

Needles: US 1 or US 2 double pointed needles

Cast on 24 stitches; divide among 3 double pointed needles.

Make ribbing: knit 2 purl 2 for 2 rows.

Make holes for horns: K2 YO K2TOG, K11 YO K2TOG, knit to end of row.

Knit 3 rows.

Make decreases for top of hat;

K4 K2TOG Repeat to end of row

K3 K2TOG Repeat to end of row

K2 K2TOG Repeat to end of row

K2TOG Repeat to end of row

Break yarn and thread through remaining stitches. Pull tight and secure end. Add optional pom-pom

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Tiny Scarf for a Mounted Buck

Yarn: About 15 yards of fingering weight

Needles: US 1 or US 2

Cast on 6 stitches. Knit the first row.

On all subsequent rows, slip the first stitch and knit the remaining 5 stitches.

Continue until the scarf is about 8 inches long.

Bind off and weave in ends.

After placing the scarf on the buck, I use a small amount of yarn to tack the scarf into the crossed position.

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
