



Sheep Ornaments

You need: Craft glue, about 0.1 ounces of yarn, a tapestry needle.




Step 1:

Apply a dab of craft glue to the back of the ornament. Place the end of the yarn on the glue to secure it.




Step 2:

Wrap the yarn around the sheep until he is as fat as you would like. If you don't have much yarn, you can add a layer of felt or stuffing to serve as filler, and cover it as you wrap.



Step 3:

Thread the yarn through a tapestry needle. With the wrong side facing, run the needle behind the wrapped yarn, against the sheep body and pull through. Trim yarn end close to the wrapped yarn.




Step 4:

Thread a scrap of yarn through the holes on the top edge of the sheep. Tie the yarn to make a loop. Hang the sheep on your tree!
